In 2002 Mr. Hollend retired allowing yet another expansion into the remaining half of Hollend's. This chain of events has allowed them to continue to welcome their customers "Home".

The Peterborough Examiner

The Examiner loves supporting excellence and the Lakefield Literary Festival, with its special people, gives this area one of the most excellent literary opportunities every year.

It was 1837 when the first newspaper was printed in Peterborough (the Backwoodsman and Sentinel). It became The Peterborough Chronicle, then (after a fire) the Peterborough Gazette.

In 1846, it was the Weekly Dispatch and later the Peterborough Dispatch.

By 1856 a leading reformer in the area as publisher called it The Peterborough Examiner.

In 1864 a prominent Liberal James Stratton bought The Examiner to begin 52 years of family ownership. It was later bought by Senator Davies for another round of family ownership. Davies would sell the paper in 1968.

Thomson Newspapers bought the business and it became part of the Hollinger Newspaper chain in the early 1990s. In 2001 the Osprey Media Group headed by the president of Hollinger took the helm.

Quebecor media group now owns the paper, the biggest daily newspaper chain in Canada.
